



Challenge Guidelines

The goal is to reduce drive alone trips to work

Challenge Description

Between October 20 and November 2, log any trips you make to work in a manner other than driving in a vehicle alone. Try walking, biking, skateboarding, transit, carpool, telecommuting, or any combination of these!

Form a team with your co-workers and compete with other workplaces from around the state. Don't have a team? No problem, you can participate as an individual. You'll be able to track where you stand against others across the state on the real-time leaderboard. Every trip you make and log will get you closer to winning prizes.

Challenge Period

October 20 - November 2, 2019

How to Participate

During this challenge you are eligible to participate as part of a workplace team or as an individual. To register your workplace, email info@commutesmart.org. If your workplace team has already been registered, employees can go directly to the NH Rideshare website to register and join the team. We suggest nominating a representative from each workplace to be a team captain and act as the main point of contact with the CommuteSmart NH team.

To register as an individual, go directly to the NH Rideshare website to register, and join our created team, the "Free Agents", a team comprised of all individuals without a team.

Once registered, and once the challenge begins, everyone can start logging trips in the Commute Log located in NH Rideshare. Trips logged for the two weeks of October 20 - November 2 will automatically be entered into the challenge. For more information on recording trips view the [NH Rideshare's trip logging guide](#).

Prizes and Prize Tiers

Prizes will be given to individuals based on the number of days logged by that individual during the challenge period:

1. **Log one day:** Log one day during the challenge and receive a Buses, Bikes & Brooms Challenge Logo sticker.
2. **Log five days:** Log five days of the challenge and receive a CommuteSmart NH water bottle filled with Halloween candy. You'll also receive the Buses, Bikes & Brooms Challenge Logo sticker.
3. **Log eight or more days:** Log eight or more days of the challenge and receive a CommuteSmart insulated travel mug. You'll also receive the Buses, Bikes & Brooms Challenge Logo sticker and a CommuteSmart NH water bottle filled with Halloween Candy.

All prizes will be given out after the challenge has ended. Prizes will be distributed through team captains or directly to individuals. CommuteSmart NH reserves the right to change any prizes at any time.

Eligibility

The Buses, Bikes, & Brooms Challenge is open to any employer and workplace in the state.

Any commute to/from work or school that eliminates driving a car alone is eligible, such as carpooling, vanpooling, riding a bicycle or skateboard, walking/running, riding the bus, and teleworking. If a commuter drives to a Park and Ride lot, then travels sustainable from there, the second leg is eligible.

Teleworkers are eligible if they live within a reasonable commute to their workplace and would otherwise drive. It is not considered teleworking if a person is away at a conference or on other business.

Off-site trips during the day are not eligible.
